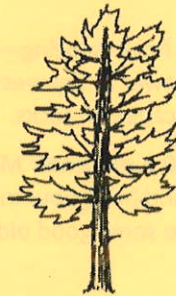

Monday, June 23rd

10:00 a.m. Nature Hike—Meet Ranger Humble at the Visitors Center on top of the dam for a leisurely hike along the Lakeside Trail. This trail leaves from the dam parking lot and hikes within some very tall trees along the lake.

Tuesday, June 24th

2:30 p.m. Lake Cruise - Join Ranger Humble for a ride in the parks pontoon boat along Norris Lake. Sign up at the park office. Space limited to 10. Meet at the marina office at 2:15. Children under 18 must be accompanied by a parent. Cost is \$7 for adults and \$6 for children 5 and under. Learn about the dam and its history and view wildlife on the lake.

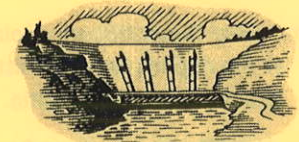


Wednesday, June 25th

11:00 a.m. Snakes Alive - Join Ranger Humble at the Rec Hall for an up close look at a live snake. Learn how to tell the difference from non to poisonous snakes.

1:00 p.m. Lenoir Museum Tour – Join Museum guide Michael at the Lenoir Museum for a fascinating look at some cool old-timey mouse traps. Also, check out the glass walking cane.

2:00 p.m. Norris Dam Walk - TVA Visitor Center —Join Manager Morgan for a leisurely walk across Norris Dam. Learn about TVA and the first building project.



Thursday, June 26th

9:00 a.m. CCC Camp Kinchen History – Join Manager Morgan at the TVA Visitor Center near the dam, then take a short drive to CCC Camp Kinchen. Located less than one mile from the dam, this CCC Camp from the 30's and 40's still has a story to tell.

10:00 a.m. Barrel Organ Demonstration – Join Manager Morgan at the Lenoir Museum to watch this early 1800's barrel organ demonstration and learn about its restoration. This organ can only be seen playing live once a year and here is your chance.
